College of Education and Behavioral Sciences

School of Teacher Education/Educational Leadership Doctoral Program

•Revise Course Grade Type - EDU 695, Advanced Topics in Education

Janet Applin presented. This course is typically used for EdD students in Teacher Leader or P-12

Administrative Leadership specializations to conduct "readings or special projects in education" (catalog description) or to receive credit for providing evidence that they hold current National Board Certification status. In either case, the awarding of a Pass/Fail grade seems more appropriate. There was a Algeo/Houchens motion to approve/second. The motion passed.

Educational Leadership Doctoral Program

•Revise Program -0010 Doctor of Education (EdD) (Educational Leadership) (2nd submission of this program revision - for 2.4 other: Revise policy by which EdD students may be awarded EDU 695, credit for education related experiences. (Update policy wording.)

Janet Applin presented. The WKU EdD program is collaborating with the Green River Regional Education Cooperative (GRREC) to develop an EdD partnership program whereby GRREC employees and affiliates may

work together on doctoral coursework and research to benefit the educational communities within GRREC and WKU's mutual areas of regional stewardship. The EDU 695 credit process allows for WKU and GRREC to develop a credit-bearing process for these partnership experiences. There was a Pyle/Houchens motion to approve/second. The motion passed.

School of Teacher Education

•Revise Course Number – EDU 300, Becoming an Effective Global Citizen
There was a Croxall/Myers motion to approve/second. Sylvia Dietrich presented. After some short discussion the motion passed.

The two added agenda items:

•Revise Program #0438, MAE: Special Education for Teacher Leaders: Moderate and Severe Disabilities
•Revise Program #0457, MAE: Special Education for Teacher Leaders: Learning and Behavior Disorders
Janet Applin spoke about these two proposals. We recently were informed that we were not approved to offer
the MSD TCHL program as we thought we were for the past several years. When EPSB instituted their new
computer system, whereby we now have to enter and exit every teacher prep student, the omission was
discovered. The MSD program, in particular, was never really approved as a stand-alone program – only
under the TCHL umbrella. The faculty have to change the admission wording so the state will again allow us
to admit students to this program. We have been turning students away for the past month because we don't
(technically) have a program to which they may be admitted.

There was a Myers/Hawkins motion to approve/second. The motion passed.

Other Business

Dr. Evans discussion:
