Understanding Costs and Fees

The WKU bill may include charges for:

- Tuition
- Course Fees
 - Amount depends on the type of course that you register for...
- Books

- In State \$5,301 per semester
 - T.I.P \$6,876 per semester
 - Out of State \$13,248 per semester

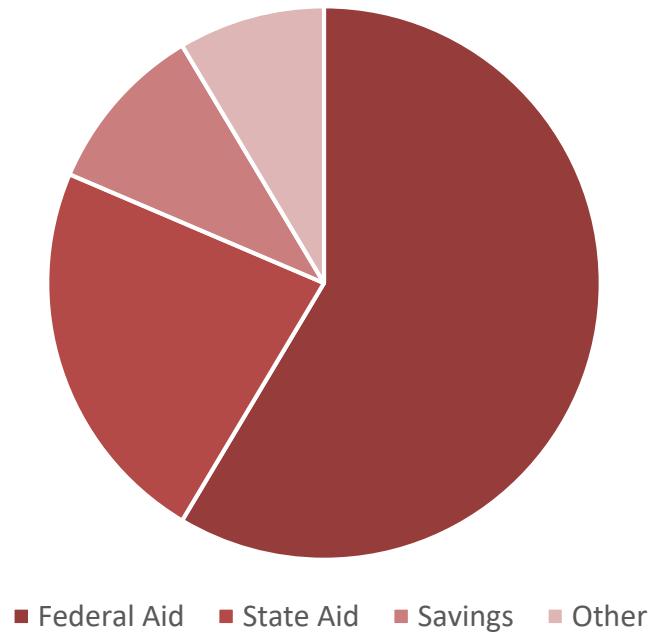


If you **do not** pay fees by the appropriate due date, you may receive:

- a \$100 late payment fee;
- and have a financial hold placed on your account
 - prevented from dropping/adding classes
 - cannot obtain your transcript

How do I pay for college?

Many people seek assistance from Federal and State financial aid to offset costs.



What is federal financial aid?

Money provided by the federal government to pay for college, graduate or professional school

- **Federal Grants**
- **Federal Student Loans**
- **Federal Work-Study**



Who is eligible for federal student aid?

- U.S. citizen or eligible noncitizen
 - Have a high school diploma, or a G.E.D. certificate
 - Valid social security number
 - Enrolled in an eligible degree program (**associates, bachelors, or masters**)
 - Meet satisfactory academic progress standards set by your school (**2.0 GPA at WKU**)
 - Registered for the Selective Service (**males only**)

Federal Grants

Federal Pell Grant

- Federal need-based funds given to undergraduate college students to assist with paying for school.
- **Expected Family Contribution (EFC)** determines eligibility
- **Not everyone will qualify for Pell Grant.**
- **For 2019-2020 AY, Maximum \$6,195 per academic year/(\$3,097 per sem.) for students enrolled full-time.**

Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (SEOG)

- Federally funded grant awarded to student's
- **Maximum (at WKU)- \$500 per academic year/(\$250 per sem.)**
- Must have a "0" EFC
- Funds are limited

Federal Student Loan (Federal Stafford Loan)



Federal Student Loan

- **Subsidized** (5.05% fixed) – need-based, student not responsible for interest during enrollment
- **Unsubsidized** (5.05% fixed) – non-need-based, student is responsible for interest during enrollment
- Fixed interest rate for the life of the loan
- Repayment deferred until 6 months after graduation or enrolled in less than half-time (6 credit hours)

Limits per academic year (dependent students)

- **Freshmen** \$5,500 per AY (\$2,750 per semester)
- **Sophomore** \$6,500 per AY (\$3,250 per semester)
- **Junior/Senior** \$7,500 per AY (\$3,750 per semester)


❖ Loan fees are deducted at the time of origination.

TRANSFER STUDENT BASE AWARD	Requirements	Amount Awarded
	Cumulative GPA of 3.8+	\$2,500 annually
	Cumulative GPA of 3.5-<3.8	\$1,500 annually


* All awards require full-time enrollment to qualify and a minimum of 24 transfer hours from a regionally accredited institution.


TARGETED AWARD	Requirements	Amount Awarded
	3.0+ GPA and Associate Degree completed within last two years from any regionally accredited institution	\$1,500 annually


* Targeted Award can be added to base award (up to cost of attendance). Official final transcript with degree awarded is required for the Targeted Award.

Renewal GPA for all awards = 3.0

KEES and C.A.P



KY Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES)

- Available only during fall and spring semesters
- 8 semester eligibility (4 yrs.)
- Must be used within 5 yrs. of high school graduation
- Transfer students must contact financial aid office to have KEES estimate placed on TopNet account

College Access Program Grant (CAP)

- **For 2019-2020AY, Maximum amount \$2,000 AY (\$1,000 per semester)**
 - To be considered for a **CAP Grant**, the **FAFSA** must be submitted early and the student must be eligible for the Federal Pell Grant. Funds are very limited!

- **8 semesters of eligibility (4 yrs.)**

How do I apply for financial aid?



1. Create your FSA ID.
 - Apply for FSA ID at www.fsaaid.ed.gov
 - Both students and parents of dependent students will need to create their FSA ID.
 - Please remember your FSA ID information for future use.
2. Apply for the FAFSA - Free Application for Federal Student Aid.
 - www.fafsa.gov (No fee to apply)
 - Beware sites that may charge you (e.g. fafsa.com).
 - Complete each academic year
 - Applications accepted beginning October 1st
3. Amount of Financial Aid may vary!

How much federal student aid am I eligible to receive?

- **FAFSA** will provide an estimate of student's eligibility
- Eligibility will be in the form of either a Federal Student Loan and/or a Federal Pell Grant.

Federal DIRECT Parent PLUS Loan

1. The Parent PLUS Loan is a federal loan allowing parents to borrow money to cover any costs not already covered by the student's financial aid package, up to the full cost of attendance.
2. Parent PLUS Loan may be listed as offered on TopNet.
3. This does not mean that the parent is automatically approved!
4. The Parent PLUS Loan requires credit pre-approval.
5. Parent should use parent information as the borrower, not student information!

Federal DIRECT Parent PLUS Loan

- The Parent(s) is responsible for repayment on the loan, **not the student!**
- **Fixed interest rate of 7.60%**
- Repayment begins 60 days after the funds are disbursed
- Payments can be deferred
- Go to www.studentloans.gov to apply
- A completed FAFSA must be on file to receive Parent PLUS Loan

Do You Need A Job?

Federal Work-Study (FWS) Program

- **Federal Work-Study** is given to colleges to provide part-time work opportunities for students.
- Must complete the **FAFSA** application even if you are not interested in other federal aid programs.
- Student can work up to 20 hours per week.
- Most jobs pay minimum wage

Verification

- A **Student Aid Report (SAR)** will be sent within 2 weeks of the completed application and will indicate if the student is selected for verification.
- **KHEAA Verify** will email students requesting all verification documents needed, as well as giving a link to the verification worksheet.
- **Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority Verify** is the provider of 2019-2020 FAFSA verification services for WKU.
- Students must submit documents to **KHEAA** and you should contact **KHEAA** regarding your verification.

Deadlines for Consortium Agreements

Summer 2019: Form Available—April 5, 2019
Last Day to Submit—August 2, 2019

Fall 2019: Form Available—June 10, 2019
Last Day to Submit—November 8, 2019

A Consortium Agreement is a written agreement between two schools. It will allow the student to receive the maximum amount of federal aid for which he/she is eligible to receive during any given academic semester.

However, a student may only receive his/her financial aid from one school.

Do I need to submit a Consortium Agreement?

All students attending two separate colleges or universities must submit a consortium request and have a consortium agreement processed if they wish to receive financial aid. Even if you are a joint enrolled student you must still submit a consortium request.

- The WKU On Demand Agreement is a contract between the Department of Student Financial Assistance, the enrolled WKU student, and the WKU On Demand Office. This agreement determines if a student is eligible to utilize financial aid to cover the cost of his/her WKU On Demand courses.
- The WKU On Demand Agreement can be completed on TopNet using your Net ID and password, choose *Financial Aid* and then *WKU On Demand/Financial Aid Request for Registration*.
