

James Garrard, Esq. Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, to all whom these presents shall come, Greeting: KNOW YE, That by virtue and in consideration of a certificate N^o 343 granted by the State of Kentucky for the relief of Settlers on the South side of Green River agreeable to an act of Assembly passed in the year 1795

there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto Archibald Felts

a certain Tract or Parcel of Land, containing

Two Hundred acres by Survey bearing date the twelfth day of August 1796. lying and being in Logan County on Gasper River and bounded as followeth To wit Beginning on a white Oak below a cedar Bluff and running down the meanders of the River North Seventy degrees West twenty four Poles thence North twenty two degrees West One hundred and sixteen Poles thence North thirty seven degrees East thirty two Poles thence North fifty eight degrees East eighty four Poles to corner Hickory on Bank of River thence due South forty Poles to corner white Oak thence North sixty degrees East Seventy Poles to corner white Oak thence South sixty five degrees East fifty five Poles to corner black Oak thence South ten degrees East One Hundred and forty Poles to corner Stake in the Barrens thence South fifty eight degrees West One hundred and eighty four Poles to the Beginning

with its appurtenances TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract or Parcel of Land, with its appurtenances, to the said Arch^d Felts

and his Heirs forever. IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the said James Garrard, Esq. Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused the seal of the Commonwealth to be affixed at Frankfort, on the 11th day of June in the year of our Lord, one thousand, seven hundred and ninety seven and of the Commonwealth the Sixth
