Unfinished Business

Bill 1-20-F

- Old logos are outdated, and the red towel iconography is now only used on an athletics level.
- New logos replacing main signs outside SGA suite and behind reception desk, in both hallways outside the chambers, and within the conference room.
- Changing logo will help SGA fit in with the university's unified branding plan.
- Showed examples of new signage, subject to final university approval.
- Old SGA photo will be taken down, still no decision on what will replace it.
- Overall cost is \$2334.45, executive is paying \$1334.45, and the Senate is being asked to pay the other \$1000.
- Senator Welch pointed out a cost discrepancy of \$110 in the bill.
- Senator McCoun clarified that what will be replacing the picture is going to be left for another bill.

• Bill passes with a vote of 28:2.
