 Organizational Aid, and begin legislation to spend discretionary money.



- Bill 1-21-S: Funding for the Intercultural Student Engagement Center Black Magic Masquerade Ball
- Bill 2-21-S: Funding for the College of Health and Human Services' Diversity Equity and Inclusion Student Group.
 - Motion made by Senator Kyle Phillips to move Bill 2-21-S to old business to expedite funding. Second by Senator Roderick Maul.

X. Old Business

- Bill 2-21-S: Funding for the College of Health and Human Services' Diversity Equity and Inclusion Student Group.
 - Senator Maul spoke in favor of the bill as author. The CHHS DEI group is looking for funding for polos to wear as they visit local schools to encourage minority students to attend a higher education institution and be part of the College of Health and Human Services. This groups speaks to students from elementary, middle, and high schools. They are looking to fund polos for current members, as well as future members. Currently have 6 members in the group.
 - Senator Tess Welch asked why the funding was coming from Legislative
 Discretionary rather than Organizational Aid. Senator Maul explained that this
 group is not a Registered Student Organization and therefore ineligible for Org Aid
 funding.
 - Senator Welch asked to friendly amend the bill from \$300 to \$500. Second by Senator Me'Lon Craighead. Senator Maul accepted as friendly.

Discussion of Bill 2-21-S concluded. Passed in a 30-0-0 vote by the Senate.
