

WKU SGA Senate Meeting

February 2, 2021

I. Called to Order at 5:00pm

II. Roll call

Secretary did a roll call. 28 senators were present at the call to order.

III. Approval of minutes from last meeting

Minutes were approved as read.

IV. Executive Cabinet Reports

- President Garrett Edmonds:
 - Nominated Will Dykeman to serve as Senator-At-Large. Will is a sophomore at WKU. Will originally ran for election in the Fall of 2020.
 - Senator Tess Welch asked why the nominee wanted to get involved with SGA.
 The nominee replied that he has a lot of ideas for legislation and planned on getting involved and staying involved with the organization.
 - Senator Dawson McCoun asked the nominee about future projects or a specific committee he was looking to join. The nominee spoke about getting involved with LRC as well as Campus Improvements to discuss possibly including printers in residence halls with the current shortened hours of computer labs across campus.
 - Senator Roderick Maul asked the nominee about his work with Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. The nominee explained he had come from a small town and had not had any prior experience with DEI but was looking forward to collaborative efforts.
 - Senator Me'Lon Craighead asked the nominee about the nominee's corse
 values. The nominee spoke about his faith as well as working towards ensuring
 that SGA's budget goes towards the good of all Hilltoppers rather than the few.

Senator Fatim Yaro asked the nominee about any ideas contributing to the
international student population on campus. The nominee spoke about outreach
to our international student population to hear ideas directly from them. He also
spoke about ensuring the students feel welcome on campus and can succeed.

- Senator Dawson McCoun spoke in favor of the nominee.


Debate concluded. Nominee was appointed by unanimous vote by the Senate. Welcome, Senator Will Dykeman to WKU SGA!

 - Stop-Loss Protection is the policy that prevents state from taking exponential
 amount of funding away from a University in the case of decreased student
 enrollment. Stop-Loss Protection currently allows funding to be decreased
 by a small percentage in areas of decreased student enrollment rather than
 stripped away all together.

• President Garrett Edmonds informed the Senate that a committee called Student Travel Policy will be formed to assess the possibility of Study Abroad in the future.



IX. New Business

- Bill 3-21-S: Organizational Aid Funding for WKU Amazing Tones of Joy, Black Women of Western, Queer Student Union, and Business Association for Development.
 - Motioned made by Senator Dawson McCoun to move Bill 1-21-S to Old Business.
 Second by Senator Tess Welch.
- Bill 4-21-S: To Support the "Drive Safely Hilltoppers" Sign Initiative.
- Resolution 1-21-S: To Support Western Kentucky University's Naming and Symbols
 Task Force.



- Bill 1-21-S: Funding for the Intercultural Student Engagement Center Black Magic Masquerade Ball.
 - o Senators Troy Davis and Me'Lon Craighead spoke in favor of Bill 1-21-S as authors.
 - Senator Tess Welch asked the authors what the cost is for students to attend. The authors believe it is \$5 for each student. This event is also open to all students!

Moved into debate.

- Senator Dawson McCoun asked the authors if would accept \$1,500 from Legislative Discretionary, \$250 from our Food Fund, and \$500 from the Organizational Aid fund as a friendly amendment. This would total \$2,250 from the legislative budget. Amendment second by Tess. Accepted as friendly by the authors.
- Senator Dawson McCoun asked for a Point of Information from President
 Garrett Edmonds about funding from the Executive Cabinet for the event.
 President Edmonds stated that the Executive Cabinet will add \$250 from the
 Executive Discretionary towards the event as well. This brings the total to
 \$2,500 from SGA for the ISEC Black Magic Masquerade Ball.

Debate concluded on Bill 1-21-S. Bill was passed through the Senate unanimously.

- Bill 3-21-S was moved into Old Business. Organizational Aid funding for WKU Amazing Tones of Joy, Black Women of Western, Queer Student Union, and Business Association for Development.
 - AVP Isaac Keller spoke in favor of the bill as Organizational Aid committee chair.
 - Senator Tess Welch made a friendly amendment to remove whereas clause for Zeta Phi Beta Inc. recruitment video as it was from a past bill. Second by Senator Dawson McCoun. Taken as friendly by the author.

Debate concluded on Bill 3-21-S. Bill was passed through the Senate unanimously.
